A Ciaran Ennis '45 and a Mark O'Sullivan free left 0-7 between the sides after 38 minutes. Two minutes later another Moynalvey goal chance was spurned when Padraic Harnan's effort went wide of the posts. O'Sullivan and Damien Sheridan traded scores, before a hat trick of points from O'Sullivan left only 0-4 between the sides, 0-14 to 0-10 with 10 minutes remaining. A superb free from county player Joe Sheridan steadied the ship for Seneschalstown, before they tagged on another score, with Moynalvey's John Donoghue sending over a consolation point in the final minute.
