O'Neill's point in the 23rd minute proved to be Moynalvey's final score of the first half, although the post did deny Colm O'Connor a goal in the 28 th minute. Another Dunboyne free extended their advantage within sixty seconds of the restart. Ennis scored his second point from play in the 3rd minute of the half before two goal chances went amiss, the first when Ennis was blocked down and the second when substitute Johnny Carey was also denied. Three Moynalvey points, two from Ennis and a second of the night from James O'Neill in response to another Dunboyne free left the goal between the sides, 1-11 to 0-11 after 18 minutes of the second period.

Three Dunboyne points left six between the sides with five minutes remaining. Moynalvey's Ennis converted his side's final score in the 56th minute, leaving five between them, 1-14 to 0-12.
